HPS 704 Doctoral Public Health Leadership for Health Equity

Catalog Description: This course aims to advance leadership development knowledge, attitudes, and practice among doctorate of public health students to advance public health policy and systems change efforts. (3 units)

- Communication
- Decision Making

- Ethical Issues in Leadership
- Negotiation and Influence
- Management

Course Objectives: During this course, students will:

- Understand different leadership theories, methods, and styles.
- Learn about personal personality attributes and how to use that understanding to choose their own leadership Methods.
- Use group decision making and the perspective of multiple professions and views to impact public health issues, including the development of a strategic plan.
- Explore the complex interaction of social and environmental factors that impact health outcomes, and how to address these through principles of health equity.
- Compare ideal approaches to address health equity with the practical limitations of political realities and discuss decision-making under various conditions.
- Compare communication strategies for fact-based decision-making for different audiences and different world

 views
- Analyze examples of leadership as applied to public health issues in the past.
- Participate in a current public health issue or decision using leadership principles.
- Monitor and participate in the legislative process as it relates to a public health issue.
- Develop a personal plan for providing future leadership in public health.

Learning Outcomes (Competencies Obtained): Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. Assess personal strengths and weaknesses in leadership, including cultural proficiency, to inform future leadership style and methods
- 2. Learn principles of influence and negotiation for better public health outcomes
- 3. Communicate public health science to diverse stakeholders, including those with varying levels of health literacy, to influence behaviors and policies
- 4. Integrate knowledge, approaches, and values from multiple professions and systems to address public health issues
- 5. Suggest interprofessional team approaches to improve public health
- 6. Use negotiation and consensus-building methods to facilitate shared decision-making
