Chicanos Por La Causa/Zuckerman Family Foundation Scholarship	\$12,500	Awarded to undergraduate students in their junior year who demonstrate a commitment to service in the Hispanic communities of Arizona and social awareness of Hispanic culture; talents and interests both inside and outside the field of Public Health. Preference will be given to applicants who have demonstrated leadership in and service to the Hispanic Community.
Cliff and Penny Crutchfield Scholarship	\$8,000	Awarded to graduate students who demonstrate a commitment to public health, public service, and leadership. Preference will be given to incoming doctoral applicants who plan to study in the area of Occupational and Environmental Health.
College of Public Health Community Advisory Board Scholarship	\$6,000- \$8,000	Awarded to graduate students with a GPA of 3.25 or higher who is making sufficient progress towards completion of their degree.
College of Public Health General Scholarship	Variable	Awarded to undergraduate or graduate students with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Recipients will demonstrate a commitment to public health, public service, and leadership. Preference will be given to applicants who plans to pursue a lifelong career in public health.
Elbridge and Genevieve Morrill Memorial Scholarship	\$3,600	Awarded to undergraduate students officially admitted to the Public Health Major with an Environmental and Occupational Health Emphasis or students admitted to the MPH graduate program in the Environmental and Occupational Health concentration. Recipients must be Arizona residents, graduates of an Arizona high school, and citizens of the United States. Selection will be based on potential to succeed in Environmental and Occupational Health.
Helen and Raymond Sarocco Scholarship	\$2,300	Supports continuing MPH students who have achieved academic excellence. Award can be renewable with continuation of need and if funds are available.
Hispanic Women's Corporation/ Zuckerman Family Foundation Student Scholarship	\$6,250	Awarded to undergraduate and graduate students who demonstrate a commitment to service in the Hispanic communities of Arizona and social awareness of Hispanic culture; talents and interest both inside and outside the field of public health. Preference will be given to applicants who have demonstrated leadership in and service to the Hispanic community.
Joel S. Meister Endowed Scholarship	\$2,623	Awarded to MPH graduate student who demonstrate a commitment to public health, public service, and leadership. Preference will be given to applicants who plans to pursue a lifelong career in public health.
Joel Valdez Scholarship/ Zuckerman Family Foundation Student Scholarship	\$15,000	Awarded to support the public health education of graduate students. Recipients will demonstrate a commitment to public health, public service, and leadership. Preference will be given to applicants who plans to pursue a lifelong career in public health.
Maureen and Edward Mangotich Scholarship	\$5,000	Awarded to continuing undergraduate or graduate student with a GPA of 3.25 or greater and is making sufficient progress towards completion of their degree. Recipients must demonstrate a commitment to public health, public service, and leadership.
Mullis Native American Scholarship Endowment	\$1,105	Awarded to undergraduate or graduate students with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Recipients will demonstrate a commitment to public health, public service, and leadership within the Native American populations in Arizona. Preference will be given to students who have demonstrated a commitment to service in communities of Arizona and social awareness of Native American culture.
Russell H. Swanson Public Health Scholarship	\$2,500	Supports incoming MPH student who demonstrates commitment to public health and leadership and plans a career in public health practice, policy or research toward eradicating health disparities and promoting healthy communities. Recipients may only receive the award once.
SueBob Scholars Endowment	\$2,500	Awarded to undergraduate or graduate students who demonstrate research engagement and a commitment to public health, public service and leadership. Preference will be given to 1st generation college students, military students (current and vets), and/or students interested in obtaining or have previously obtained a bachelor's or master's nursing degree.

U.S. Surgeon General Richard Carmona Distinguished Public Health Preparedness Scholarship	\$3,303	Awarded to undergraduate or graduate students who are pursuing research and/or a career in public health preparedness to include pandemics. Preference will be given to first generation college students, veterans and/or military students who have a commitment to underserved communities. Recipients are encouraged to give a brief presentation on public health preparedness issues at the annual scholarship luncheon or similar public forum.
The Zuckerman Family Foundation African American Scholarship	\$6,250	Awarded to undergraduate or graduate student who demonstrate commitment to public health, public service and leadership within the African American populations in Arizona. Preference will be given to students who have demonstrated a commitment to service in communities of Arizona and social awareness of African American culture.
The Zuckerman Family Foundation Hispanic American Scholarship	\$1,250	Awarded to undergraduate or graduate student who demonstrate commitment to public health, public service and leadership within the Hispanic populations in Arizona. Preference will be given to students who have demonstrated a commitment to service in communities of Arizona and social awareness of Hispanic culture.
The Zuckerman Family Foundation Native American/Pascua Yaqui Tribe Scholarship	\$1,625	Awarded to undergraduate or graduate student who demonstrate commitment to public health, public service and leadership within the Native American populations in Arizona. Preference will be given to students who have demonstrated a commitment to service in communities of Arizona and social awareness of Native American culture.
The Zuckerman Family Foundation Scholarship Endowment	\$5,000	Awarded to undergraduate or graduate students pursuing a degree in the College of Public Health who demonstrates a commitment to public health, public service, and leadership.
