What is a Student Ambassador?

A Mel and Enid Zuckerman College of Public Health (MEZCOPH) Student Ambassador will be expected to professionally and proudly represent the student perspective of the College to prospective and new students and family, the University of Arizona community, and other groups/organizations as called upon. Ambassadors are expected to communicate and present information about the College at various events. Being selected as a MEZCOPH Student Ambassador is an honor that reflects academic rigor and a commitment to the field of public health. Becoming an ambassador means you are involved in an Engaged Learning Activity, which can go on your transcript and can be considered by future employers to showcase your involvement and academic engagement.

Examples of Recruitment Activities

- Meet with prospective and admitted students
- Volunteer for AHSC-sponsored middle school and high school events
- Outreach and presentations to campus clubs and organizations
- Staff tabling events at various events on and off campus
- Serve on student panels for visit days
- Social media posts for the College of Public Health
- Lots of other fun outreach/recruitment activities

Time Commitment

Ambassadors must be able to commit an average of 1-2 hours per week to the position, not including recruitment events and activities for which they are assigned.

Who is eligible?

- Undergraduate students with a major in public health or pre-public health
- 2.75 minimum cumulative GPA
- Must have Fridays from 12-1pm available for Ambassador Meetings
- Must have at least 30 completed units (have sophomore class standing) as of the end of the current semester and have completed at least two full semesters as a pre-public health or public health major.
- Have commitment to promoting the College for at least two semesters (BOTH Fall and Spring)
